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General rule establishing an automatic export notification requirement

On June 3, 2025, the Ministry of Economy published the “General Rule establishing an automatic export notification” (the “**Rule**” or “General Rule”) in the Official Gazette of the Federation. The General Rule seeks to establish an automatic notification scheme (*aviso automático*) for several categories of goods when such goods are destined for export.

The General Rule addresses the need identified by the Ministry of Economy to adapt its control mechanisms to the structural changes in international trade and the emergence of new supply models within global value chains. The Ministry of Economy considers it essential to implement more efficient and accurate monitoring schemes for foreign trade transactions, particularly exports.

I. Goods affected by the automatic export notification requirement

Among the goods that are subject to this automatic notification requirement, the following should be highlighted:

- Malt beer
- Tequila
- Unwrought silver
- Catalytic converters and particulate filters to purify or filter gases.
- Memory units
- Insulated wires, cables, and other insulated electrical conductors
- Automatic machines for data treatment or processing, and their units
- Fiber optic cables
- Lighting or visual signaling devices
- Telephones, including smartphones and other cell phones and those on other wireless networks

II. Submission procedure

Under the General Rule, in order to obtain the automatic export notification, a written request for each customs declaration must be submitted to the email address aviso.exportacion@economia.gob.mx.

The information must also be submitted to the Directorate-General for Trade Facilitation and Foreign Trade (Dirección General de Facilitación Comercial y de Comercio Exterior) (DGFCCCE) using the spreadsheet format that will be published for this purpose on the website of the National Foreign Trade Information Service (Servicio Nacional de Información de Comercio Exterior) (SNICE).

Once these requirements have been met, the DGFCCCE will issue the corresponding automatic export notification by tariff item within ten business days and will send it to the email addresses provided by the applicant.

III. Entry into force

Finally, the General Rule will enter into force the day after its publication in the Official Gazette of the Federation, namely, June 4, 2025.

However, after the publication of this General Rule, on the website of the National Foreign Trade Information Service, the official communication number 516.2025.1850 was published, which states that to assist companies, the entry into force of the Rule will be postponed until July 7, 2025, with June 30, 2025 established as the start date for the submission of applications.
